### FLOWERS AND POT PLANTS

- 1 **POLYANTHUS**, single stem, any colour, with own foliage, **In pot or garden**
- 2 **PRIMULA** (excluding Polyanthus or Primrose), in pot or garden, 1 plant
- 3 **ANEMONES**, 1 blooms
- 4 **HARDY CUT FLOWERS**, grown in the open, excluding shrubs, one vase of any one kind not otherwise provided for.
- 5 **ANY POT PLANT IN BLOOM** (excluding Auricula, Azalea, Cyclamen, Orchids, Primula, Rhododendron), 1 plant
- 6 **ANY FOLIAGE POT PLANT** (not necessarily in bloom)
- 7 **CYCLAMEN**, 1 in pot or garden
- 8 **RHODODENDRON** or **AZALEA**, photo of 1 spray
- 9 **HELLEBORES**, may be mixed, displayed in bowl, max 7 flowers
- 10 **CAMELLIA**, photo of 1 spray
- 11 **CACTI**, 1 plant in pot or pan
- 12 **SUCCULENT,** 1 plant in pot or pan

NARCISSUS (see classification tips below)

- 13 NARCISSUS, Miniature (not exceeding 20 cm in height), photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 14 **NARCISSUS**, photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 15 NARCISSUS, Trumpet (Division 1), photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 16 NARCISSUS, large-cupped variety (Division 2) photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 17 NARCISSUS, small-cupped (Division 3) or Poeticus (Division 9) photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 18 **NARCISSUS,** Small-cupped (Division 3) or Pheasant eye, photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 19 NARCISSUS, Double (Division 4), photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 20 NARCISSUS, Bunch-flowered with multiple flowers on stem. photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden

#### **CLASSIFICATION OF NARCISSUS**

- Division 1. Trumpet: Trumpet or corona as long or longer than perianth segments (petals), one flower to a stem
- **Division 2. Large-cupped**: Cup or corona more than one third of but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments (petals), one flower to a stem
- Division 3. Small-cupped: Cup or corona not more than one third of the length of the perianth segments (petals)
- **Division 4. Double**: One or more flowers to a stem; with doubling of the perianth segments (petals), or corona (cup), or both
- Division 5. Triandrus hybrids: Two or more pendent flowers to a stem; perianth segments (petals) reflexed
- **Division 6. Cyclamineus hybrids**: One flower to a stem; perianth segments (petals) significantly reflexed; flower at an acute angle to the stem, with a very short pedicel (neck)
- Division 7. Jonquilla hybrids: One to five (rarely eight) flower to a stem; 7perianth segments (petals) spreading or reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, ususally wider than long; flowers usually fragrant
- Division 8. Tazetta hybrids: Three to twenty flowers to a stout stem; perianth segments (petals) spreading, not reflexed; flowers usually fragrant
- Division 9. Poeticus hybrids: Usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments pure white; corona very short or discshaped; flowers usually fragrant
- Division 10. Bulbocodium hybrids: Usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments (petals) insignificant compared with dominant corona

- Division 11. Split-corona: Corona split, usually for more than half its length
- Division 12. Other daffodils of garden origin: Daffodils which do not fit the definition of any other division
- Division 13. Daffodils distinguished solely by botanical name: Wild species daffodils

The division in which a named cultivar is placed can be established by reference to Daffseek (<u>http://www.daffseek.org</u>)

- 21 BULBOUS PLANT (other than Tulips, Muscari or Narcissus), 1 pot
- 22 **TULIPS**, **miniature**, photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 23 **TULIPS, single**, photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 24 **TULIPS**, **double**, photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 25 **HYACINTH**, photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
- 26 **MUSCARI (GRAPE HYACINTHS)**, photo of 1 bloom in pot or garden
