Class Alpine, Cacti and Succulents

- 1 Hardy Rock Plant, 1 in pot, not exceeding 32 cm external diameter
- 2 1 pot Sempervivum
- 3 Bowl of cut flowers of Rock Plants (including dwarf shrubs) container not to exceed 30 cms external diameter
- 4 Cactus or Succulent in bloom
- 5 Cacti, 3 pots or pans, each a different variety, 1 plant in each pot
- 6 Cactus, 1 pot or pan
- 7 Succulents, other than Cacti, 3 pots or pans, each different
- 8 Succulent, other than Cactus, 1 pot or pan
- 9 Succulents (including Cactus) 3 pots not exceeding 10 cm external diameter, each a different variety
- 10 Display of Succulents, (including Cacti) Display for a patio in a container not exceeding 40 cm in length or width



Roses

- 11 Roses, Large Flowered, vase of 3 blooms, each different
- 12 Roses, Large flowered, vase of 3 blooms, 1 variety
- 13 Rose, Large Flowered, 1 bloom
- 14 Roses, vase of 3 blooms, to be judged on fragrance
- 15 Roses, Cluster Flowered, 1 stem
- 16 Rose, Climbing, 1 piece of branch not to exceed 60cm in length
- 17 Miniature/Patio Rose in pot

- 18 A vase of Salvias, may be mixed
- 19 Sweet Pea, vase of 6 stems, may be mixed
- 20 Tuberous Begonias, outdoor, 3 blooms, may be mixed
- 21 Hardy Geraniums, (not Pelargoniums) vase of 5 blooms, may be mixed
- 22 Carnations, outdoor, vase of 3 blooms, may be mixed
- 23 Pelargoniums, vase of 3 blooms, may be mixed
- 24 Violas, 5 blooms, may be mixed
- 25 Pansies, 5 blooms, may be mixed
- 26 Asters, double, vase of 5 blooms, may be mixed (excluding Michaelmas Daisies)
- 27 Asters, single, vase of 5 blooms, may be mixed (excluding Michaelmas Daisies)
- 28 Annuals, 1 vase of 1 species, excluding Aster/Sweetpea
- 29 Heleniums, 1 vase of 3 stems
- 30 Clematis, 1 spray
- 31 Vase of cut flowers, may be mixed
- 32 Bowl of floating flowers, displayed for effect, may be mixed
- 33 Hardy Herbaceous flowers, 1 vase of 1 variety
- 34 Hardy Herbaceous flowers, 2 vases, a different species in each
- 35 Hardy Herbaceous flowers, 2 vases, 2 varieties of a single species
- 36 Hydrangea hortensis (Mophead), 1 vase, 3 blooms, may be mixed

- 38 Any other Hydrangea, 1 vase, 3 blooms, may be mixed
- 39 Hydrangea, 1 bloom
- 40 Michaelmas Daisies, vase of 3 stems, may be mixed
- 41 Gladiolus, 1 spike, large flowered
- 42 Gladiolus, vase of 3 spikes, large flowered, may be mixed
- 43 Gladiolus, vase of 3 spikes, 1 or more varieties other than large flowered (eg Primulinus)
- 44 Agapanthus, 3 stems

Dahlias

- 46 Dahlias, 3 vases, 3 blooms in each vase, one cultivar per vase
- 47 Dahlias, Decorative, 1 vase, 3 blooms
- 48 Dahlias, Cactus or Semi-Cactus, 1 vase, 3 blooms
- 49 Dahlias, Pompom, 1 vase, 3 blooms, flowers fully double, almost round in shape with tightly quilled petals. Flower size not to exceed 52mm in diameter.
- 50 Dahlias, Miniature, 1 vase, 3 blooms, may be mixed
- 51 Show Dahlias, 3 vases, 1 bloom in each
- 52 Dahlias, single flowered, vase of 3 stems of 1 cultivar
- 53 Dahlias, 3 blooms not provided for in previous classes



POT PLANTS

- 60 Pelargonium in flower, in a pot not to exceed 20 cm external diameter
- 61 Pelargoniums in flower, 3 distinct in pots, not to exceed 20 cm external diameter
- 62 Cape Primrose (Streptocarpus), 1 plant in a pot
- 63 Fuchsia, in a pot
- 64 Fern, (excluding Asparagus 'Fern'), in a pot
- 65 Orchids in bloom, 1 or more plants of the same variety in a pot
- 66 Any unusual plant
- 67 Pot plant, (excluding ferns), not necessarily in bloom, to be judged for foliage effect
- 68 Hosta, 1 pot for foliage effect
- 69 Pot plant, 1 plant in a pot, any cool greenhouse or house plant in bloom not otherwise provided for
- 70 Hanging basket, ornamental
- 71 A container, planted for effect with 2 or more plants, maximum dimension 40cm x 40cm

Flower, Plant & Vegetable collections

- 81 2 vases of cut flowers, may be mixed; 2 pot plants; *either* 2 vegetables, 3 of each kind, *or* 2 fruits, 2 distinct kinds, not more than 5 of each kind.
- 82 A gourmet collection to comprise any 3 of the following, variety to be named: 1 lettuce, 3 courgettes, 5 mangetout or sugarsnap peas, 1 bouquet garni (bunched ready for use), 1 dish cherry tomatoes, 1 dish edible flowers
- 83 A collection of vegetables, not exceeding 5 kinds, selected from the following: cabbage 1 head; lettuce 1 head; onions 3 bulbs; beetroot 3 roots; peas 6 pods; French beans 6 pods; runner beans 6 pods; broad beans 6 pods; potatoes 3 tubers; carrots 3 roots; cauliflower 1 head; celery 1 head; sweetcorn 1 cob; vegetable marrow 1

Gluten Free Orange Almond Cake A Rachel Allen Recipe

Ingredients:

200grams of butter, softened and cubed
 275grams of caster sugar
 Grated zest of 2 oranges
 Grated zest of 1 lemon
 5 eggs
 350grams of ground almonds

Syrup: Juice of 2 oranges and 1 lemon
 75grams of caster sugar

Preheat oven to Gas Mark 3/ 170/ 325f

Butter a 23 cm loose bottomed tin and line the base with baking parchment

Beat the butter until soft and light

Add in the sugar and continue to beat until fluffy

Beat in the grated zest

Beat in the eggs one at a time, don't worry if the batter looks a bit curdled

Fold in the ground almonds and scrape the batter into the prepared tin.

Place in the oven and bake for 55 – 60 minutes or until the top is firm and a skewer come out clean.

Once baked allow the cake to sit for a minute before turning it out on to a plate.

While the cake is cooling make the syrup.

Put the juice and sugar in to a sauce pan bring to the boil, allow the liquid boil for about ten minutes until it has reduced to a syrup

Use a skewer or a thin chop stick to poke some holes through the cake, this allows the syrup to be fully absorbed. Spoon the syrup over the cake,

There are two categories for Exhibitor of the Year Competition:

(a) Fruit & Vegetables (b) Cut Flowers & Pot Plants.

The names of the exhibitors obtaining the highest aggregate of points in the Open Horticultural Classes in each of the two categories (a) and (b) above at each show will be forwarded to the Association for inclusion in this competition. Points will be determined on the basis of 3,2,1 for 1st, 2nd & 3rd respectively in all individual classes. Exhibitors may exhibit at any number of shows but only their top 6 highest points will count. Results will be recorded and distributed after each show and awards will be presented at the End of Season Show held on October 23, and hosted by HSHS
